






### A Framework for Marginality in Sport

## An agenda for Social Justice

- Social Justice conceptualisation of a society where justice is achieved in practice as well within the confined of legislation and policy development.
  - Marginal people are often stigmatized in part because of multiple discrimination and human rights violations


