UPDATE - Participation Criteria and Deadlines for the 2020 World Para Swimming European Open Championships (50m)

Dear NPC President / Secretary General,

World Para Swimming is pleased to invite you to the postponed 2020 World Para Swimming European Open Championships to be held in Funchal, Portugal on 16 May – 22 May 2021. Training and classification (PI, VI and II) will be from the 12-15 May and the competition dates are 16-22 May.

This competition provides an opportunity to qualify for the Tokyo 2020 Paralympic Games and is a key classification opportunity before the Tokyo 2020 classification deadline (all athletes participating in Tokyo 2020 Paralympic Games must have a “Confirmed” or “Review with Fixed Date in 2022 or beyond” classification status).

The events on the competition programme are the same events as for 2019 World Para Swimming Championships (Paralympic Games programme plus some additional events), and therefore this is a great opportunity to experience the competitive level just few months before the biggest event in the Paralympic cycle.

With the information below World Para Swimming is providing details related to the list of events, participation criteria and deadlines for the 2020 World Para Swimming European Open Championships (50m).

Swimmers Eligibility

To be eligible for selection by an NPC for the 2020 World Para Swimming European Open Championships (50m) swimmers must:

- hold an active World Para Swimming license for the 2021 Season
- have achieved a Minimum Qualification Standard (MQS) at a World Para Swimming Recognised 50m Competition for an event on the programme between 01 January 2019 and 11th April 2021 (times are only recognised if the athlete was already licensed at the

time of the achievement or has a recognised split time World/Regional record in the same length & stroke, that is included in the rankings)

- be classified with a “Review” (R)*, “Fixed Date Review” (FDR) or “Confirmed” (C) sport class status
- one relay specific athlete (without MQS) can be added to the NPC Team (no participation in other events is allowed in this case) – please contact the World Para Swimming office for such addition by 31 March. There can be a different relay-specific athlete entered for the different relays on the final programme.

Note: The MQS was set on 20th place of the official European ranking list 01 January 2018-01 July 2019. If there were not 20 athletes, the average time on the last two on the rankings was used as an MQS.

MQS have remained the same due to the lack of competition data due to the covid-19 pandemic.

To encourage participation for S1 and S2 athletes there will be no MQSs for these events.

For relay events there are no MQS times, teams can be entered even without previous achievement (they will be seeded with ‘no time’). NPCs that have a time for their relay team from the qualification period can enter this result in the final entries.

** R status swimmers – following input from a variety of sources and after consulting with the WPS Athlete Advisory Group, we have reviewed the position on the entry criteria for R status swimmers. A decision has been taken that if a swimmer is left in R status due to no classification slot being available to them at this event, they will be able to compete in heats and finals. R status swimmers competing under this exception will be eligible for medals in any category they are eligible for (European and or open). Please note that Rule 10.17.10 still applies regarding records – athletes with R status will not be able to set records. It is acknowledged that we are in exceptional circumstances this year due to the pandemic and we are taking this decision as we believe that it will best support the athletes during these times in their preparation for the Games.*

Entry Forms

The Online Entry forms are through the IPC Online Entry System (EBS) <https://db.ipc-services.org/sdms/app/login> Once in SDMS navigate to the "IPC Online Entries System". Please refer to online manual.

Wild Card Entry

NPCs without or with only 1 qualified athlete can apply for a Wild Card. For Wild Card entry opportunity please contact the World Para Swimming office by 19 March 2021. The Wild Card slot is allocated to the individual athlete(s), not to the respective NPC.

- A maximum of one (1) male slot and one (1) female slot may be granted if an NPC has not obtained any qualification slot otherwise.
- NPCs who have obtained only one (1) qualification slot may be given one (1) or two (2) extra slots as per:

Qualified swimmer	Wild Card slot
1 female	1 female and/or 1 male slot
1 male	1 or 2 female slot(s)

For Wild Card entries, at the discretion of World Para Swimming, the swimmer’s eligibility criteria of being classified with a “Review” (R) or “Confirmed” (C) sport class status may be waived to allow an athlete with a “New” (N) sport class status who can evidence that they have achieved the MQS standard for Tokyo 2020.

Direct Invitation

World Para Swimming reserves the right to directly invite athletes under the following criteria:

- Have Tokyo 2020 potential
- To enable the greater representation by nation;
- To ensure events featured on the programme have sufficient representation for viability;
- To enable greater representation by gender;
- To ensure the further representation of athletes with high support needs
- To ensure top athletes that may have not had the opportunity to formally qualify due to extraordinary circumstances.



To be considered for a direct invite slot, an athlete must hold an IPC Athlete License for the 2021 season. At discretion of World Para Swimming the swimmer's eligibility criteria of being classified with a "Review" (R) or "Confirmed" (C) sport class status may be waived to allow an athlete with a "New" (N) sport class status to compete if they meet the Direct Invitation criteria.

Competition Format

The 2020 World Para Swimming European Open Championships will be conducted by the Single Class competition format. Only events that meet the Event Viability Criteria outlined below after the Entry by Name will be included in the Final Event Programme. Sport classes without a viable event will be able to "swim up" to the nearest single class event included in the Programme. These sport classes will be considered Eligible Classes for the respective single class event, and medals will be not allocated separately for these Eligible Classes.

Event Viability Criteria

Individual events will be considered viable if they have a minimum of six (6) eligible swimmers from three (3) NPCs entered through the Entry by Name. For classes S1-2 and S11 five (5) eligible athletes from two (2) NPCs through Entry by Name is required.

Relay events will be considered viable if they have a minimum of four (4) eligible NPCs entered through the Entry by Name.

Maximum Entry per NPC

NPCs can enter a maximum of three (3) eligible swimmers per medal event if all have met the MQS. If there is more than one eligible class in the single sport class event, a maximum of five (5) swimmers per event can be entered per each NPC. However, only a maximum of three (3) swimmers per each eligible sport class can be entered if all met the MQS.

NPCs can enter their athletes that have met at least one (1) MQS in an unlimited number of events.

NPCs can enter 1 Relay Team per relay event.

Results

Results from heats and finals will be distributed considering all achievements (regardless of the athlete being from European or non-European NPC), but the start list for finals of each event shall include min. 3 athletes from European NPCs (where available).

Medals

There will be two sets of medals.

The Championships medals will be awarded to the first three (3) European athletes/teams finishing the event (regardless of the sport class) and presented during a Victory Ceremony.

In the exceptional cases where there are not 3 Europeans in the finals (due to lack of sufficient European entries) the 'minus one rule' will be implemented:

- If there is only 1 European in the finals – no medal will be awarded
- If there are only 2 European entries in finals, then only a gold medal would be awarded. To clarify, if one of those 2 in final then gets disqualified, there is still 1 medal awarded as both athletes concluded the race. However, if there is e.g. a medical withdrawal from one of the 2 European athletes, and the race is concluded by 1 European swimmer only, then no medal will be awarded.
- If there are 3 Europeans in the finals all 3 medals are presented. To clarify, if one of those 3 in final then gets disqualified, there are still 3 medals awarded as all three athletes concluded the race. However, if there is e.g. a medical withdrawal from one of the 3 European athletes, and the race is concluded by 2 European swimmers only, then only a gold medal will be awarded.

Additionally, there will be a second complete set of Open medals also available to all competing athletes (includes those from European and non-European countries) finishing in an overall medal position.

In this case the following Championship medals will be awarded on the victory podium:

- gold: NED
- silver: DEN
- bronze: GER

Additionally, the following Open medals will be awarded:

- gold: AUS
- silver: NED
- bronze: CAN

Swimwear

Regulations outlined in the <https://www.paralympic.org/swimming/rules-and-regulations> January 2018 will apply; swimwear (caps, goggles and swimsuits) must be from the approved list.

Advertising

Regulations outlined in <https://www.paralympic.org/swimming/rules-and-regulations> Advertising Guidelines 2018 will apply.

An updated version of the swim cap guidelines for Madeira 2020 World Para Swimming European Open Championships will be shared with the nation's 7 weeks prior the first day of competition.

Competition Fee

The Competition Fee covers Championships services for 11 May – 24 May 2021 (from official arrival to departure date).

The Competition Fee for the 2020 World Para Swimming European Open Championships is 500 EUR per Team Member.

For any arrangements outside of the above period is to be dealt with directly by the LOC.

Covid-19 Management

A plan will be developed and circulated and distributed during March 2021 that will outline the Covid-19 guidelines that will be in place for the championships. These will be subject to amendments based on Covid-19 updates that are present in the host nation.

All teams, swimmers and support staff will be required to sign up and agree to abide by the covid-19 guidelines set out for these championships.

Financial Regulations

The Competition Fee is to be paid to World Para Swimming by 11 April 2021 in accordance to the invoice that can be downloaded from the on-line entry system following the Entry by Number submission.

Following the deadline of Entry by Number (31March 2021) there will be no reimbursement for any team members withdrawn, except for athletes entered into a non-viable event or due to a recent World Para Swimming verified medical cases (in this case official medical documents are required).

Should there be any additional team members added following the Entry by Number (max. 15% increase of NPC delegation entered with the Entry by Number is allowed) please contact the office. In this case a second invoice will be sent to NPC to be paid no later than 16 April 2021.

We hope the above information clarifies the competition regulations to be applied for the 2020 World Para Swimming European Open Championships and we wish you good luck for your team!
