

World Para Alpine Skiing Competitions Season 2021/2022

Athletes must have a valid 2021/22 World Para Alpine Skiing licence to be considered to compete.

Athlete must be internationally classified with either a 'Confirmed' sport class status or a 'Review' sport class status with a review date after the 2021/2022 season (R22).

1. World Para Alpine Skiing World Cups

The Maximum number of athletes in both genders and three classes on Para Alpine skiing World Cup event is 120.

Athletes must meet the following to compete in World Para Alpine Skiing World Cup Competitions:

Speed Disciplines (Downhill, Super G and Super Combined):

- Men must have **below** 140 WPAS points on the WPAS points list in DH, SG or SC to qualify for DH, SG and SC.
- Women must have **below** 180 WPAS points on the WPAS points list in DH, SG or SC to qualify for DH, SG and SC.

Tech Disciplines (Giant Slalom and Slalom) :

- Men must have **below** 140 WPAS points on the GS or SL WPAS points list to qualify for SL and GS.
- Women must have **below** 180 WPAS points on the GS or SL WPAS points list to qualify for GS or SL.

1.2 World Para Alpine Skiing World Cups wild card application

Athletes must meet the following to be considered "Wild Card Eligible":

Speed Disciplines (Downhill, Super-g and Super Combined):

- Men must have below 240 WPAS points on the current list in either of the speed disciplines, or have achieved less than 200 points in one of the three speed disciplines in a race preceding the current World Cup race.
- Women must have below 280 WPAS points on the current list in either of the speed disciplines, or have achieved less than 240 points in one of the three speed disciplines in a race preceding the current World Cup race

Tech Disciplines (SL, GS):

- Men must have below 280 WPAS points on the current list in either of the tech disciplines, or have achieved less than 240 points in one of the two technical disciplines in a race preceding the current WC race

- Women must have below 300 WPAS points on the current list in either of the tech disciplines, or have achieved less than 260 points in one of the two technical disciplines in a race preceding the current WC race

The Coaches Advisory Group (CAG) is responsible for checking the eligibility of the Wildcard applications and make a recommendation to the WPAS Management for final approval.

2. World Para Alpine Skiing Europa Cups/NorAm qualification model

Athletes must meet the following to compete in World Para Alpine Skiing Europa Cups/NorAm Competitions:

Speed Disciplines (Downhill, Super G and Super Combined):

- Men must have points below 240 WPAS points on the WPAS points list in DH, SG or SC to qualify for DH, SG and SC.
- Women must have points below 280 WPAS points on the WPAS points list in DH, SG or SC to qualify for DH, SG and SC.

Technical Discipline (Slalom, Giant Slalom)

- Open for all athletes

2.1 World Para Alpine Skiing Europa Cups/NorAm wild card application

Athletes must meet one of the following to be considered “Wild Card Eligible”:

Speed Disciplines (Downhill, Super G and Super Combined):

- For European Cup / NorAm wild cards, the competitors must be at a maximum 320 WPAS points on either the SG, SC or DH WPAS Points lists.
- For European Cup / NorAm wild cards, the competitors must be at a maximum of 180 WPAS points for men and 220 points Women on the GS Points lists.
- If any athletes achieve 240 (men) or 280 (women) points or less in a WPAS/NC race preceding EC/NorAm races (*Example provided below), they will be permitted a wild card to compete in the EC/NorAm race at the same location.

*Example: If any athlete achieves 240(men)/280(women) or less points on any of the SG races on 17 December, they will be allowed to participate in the SG races of the scheduled NorAm.
