12. Visa information and Attention for NPCs/NFs

The accreditation will not function as a visa to enter the country. It is the responsibility of each National Paralympic Committee (NPCs) or National Federation (NFs) to verify and process their visa if necessary. More information will be provided in a timely manner in the coming weeks. Stay updated with any information provided by the LOC.

13. Airport information

The official airport is the Alfonso Bonilla Aragón (CLO) in the city of Palmira that serves the city of Cali, from there the LOC will provide transportation to and from the official hotels. The Alfonso Bonilla Aragon International Airport is located 40 minutes from the city of Cali with a distance of 21.6 km.

The airport has two domestic terminals (A and B) and an international terminal (C) where Avianca Airlines, Delta Airlines, American Airlines, Copa Airlines, among others, operate.

At the airport you will find an arrivals and departures coordinator, as well as a group of volunteers who will guide and accompany the delegations to the pick-up point of the transportation that will take them to the respective hotel according to the established schedule.

For delegations entering the country through the El Dorado International Airport in Bogota, there will be a group of volunteers who will guide them to the corresponding exit from the international terminal to the national terminal for their connection.

14. Flight information

The LOC will request the NPCs / NFs to complete the information about the flights, this information must be sent complete and on time to guarantee the transportation at the airport, if the information is not provided as requested the service will not be provided. The deadline for submitting the information is April 30, 2025.

15. Accreditation (ACR)

Accreditation is the only official pass that grants rights and privileges according to category. Therefore, the head of each delegation must go to the information desk at the hotel where their delegation is staying. If any corrections are required, the Chef de Mission must go to the Accreditation Center located at the Pedro Grajales Athletics Stadium.

a. Access with accreditation

All team members must wear their accreditation at all times to enter the official championship venues, displaying it clearly visible to security personnel. Accreditation is non-

transferable and only authorizes entry to the person to whom it was issued. Misuse of accreditation may result in its cancellation

b. Loss or theft of accreditation

The loss or theft of accreditation must be reported immediately to the Accreditation Center. To obtain new accreditation, the team member must go to the Accreditation Center accompanied by their team leader or the highest-ranking official of the delegation, carrying the corresponding identity document. Any damaged or lost accreditation will be cancelled in the accreditation system, and a new one will be issued at the expense of the person requesting it. Access to the Accreditation Center is through the National Sports School, located at Calle 9 #34-01.

c. Accreditation Center opening hours

16. Special passes

The LOC will provide a special pass - bracelet as needed for the following categories

a. TIC Passes

One TIC Pass per team to be distributed at the TIC (A second pass may be requested if the size of a delegation is large. The request can be made by email to the LOC and is subject to LOC approval).

b. Coach Passes

They will be used during the whole period of the Grand Prix Event and are linked to the accreditation. In order to apply for a coach's pass you must do it at the TIC, once the pass is

given you must hand in the accreditation and return the pass to obtain the accreditation again.



17. Transportation

Transportation service between the Official Airport and the Official Team Hotels will only be provided to NPCs who have provided accurate flight information before **April 30th,2025**; the LOC transportation team will arrange vehicles of the appropriate size based on the information provided by the NPCs.

Transportation between Official Team Hotels and Training/Competition and Qualification Venues. Vehicles will be available on a scheduled basis to transport participants from official team hotels to training/competition venues. Please check with your hotel desk for details.

As it is not always possible to board the vehicle immediately, it is necessary for athletes to come to the pick-up location well in advance when using vehicles.

Notes: Follow the instructions of the transport personnel to operate the vehicle in accordance with Colombian traffic regulations.

a. Accreditation transport rights

Only package holders with their accreditations will be allowed to board the team buses between the official team hotels and the training/competition venues.

b. Transportation to the FOP

The LOC will arrange transportation between the official team hotels and the competition site.

NOTE: **The LOC** will not be responsible for any delay in the competition or other inconvenience due to the use of public transportation.

18. Medical services

The LOC will arrange for emergency care and first aid at the warm-up and competition venues and provide transportation to the appropriate medical facility for all athletes, team officials, staff, WPA representatives and other accredited clients.

19.Insurance

Participating teams are responsible for taking out their own insurance for all members of their delegation for the entire duration of the event.

20. Functional Classification

International classification for PI, VI and II will be available at the WPA Cali Grand Prix for all athletes with New (N), Review (R) or Review with Fixed Review Date of 2025 (R-2025) or earlier status for three days: May 13-15, 2025. To be eligible to participate athletes must be licensed for the 2025 season and be registered in the IPC Online Entry System by the registration deadline (March 27, 23:59 CET).

World Para Athletics (WPA) will provide the qualification schedule to the Local Organizing Committee (LOC), which will be responsible for distributing it to each NPC or NF.

Please note that it is the responsibility of each Team Manager/Chef de Mission to ensure that the athletes listed on the Classification Schedule are available and present at their Evaluation Session at least 30 minutes prior to the assigned time, date and location. This allows sufficient time for the identification check, as well as to review and sign the Athlete Evaluation Agreement Form.

21. Anti-Doping

Testing will be conducted by the Colombian National Anti-Doping Organization (COLNADO), which is the national agency of the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA).

22.Venue

The Pedro Grajales International Track and Field Stadium is located in the Jaime Aparicio Sports Unit. It has an 8-lane Mondo track, 2 high jump areas, 2 long jump and triple jump areas, including landing zones in both directions, with a width of 3 m, permanent discus cage and 1 portable cage for seated throws, 2 javelin throwing areas, 2 weight throwing circles for ambulant throwers and an adequate number of throwing platforms, it also has an alternate 4-lane Mondo track.




Figure 3 Render of Competition Track and Field




Figure 4 Competition Venue Map

23. Competition

For this event, the updated World Para Athletics (WPA) rules and regulations will apply and can be found at https://paralympic.org/athletics/rules.

24. Technical meeting

The Technical Meeting will be held in person at the Host Hotel at 17:00 hours on Thursday, May 15, 2025. Only two representatives per team per NPCs / NFs may attend the Technical Meeting. The meeting will be chaired by the WPA Technical Delegate in English.

- Written questions

All questions and proposals concerning the procedures of the competition must be made in English by using the "Questions for the Technical Meeting" form which will be shared in advance. The Form must be submitted no later than May 14th, 2025, at 16:00. A summary of all submitted questions and answers will be shared with the Team Leaders before the Technical Meeting.

25. Confirmation of starting heights, distances and progressions

The qualifying procedure for the track events, the starting heights and the height of the high jump bar will be determined by the Technical Delegate at the Technical Meeting. Team leaders will be informed of the decision at the Technical Meeting. Full documentation of the qualification procedures will also be available at the TIC Stadium.

26. Sports equipment

a. Markers

Athletes are not allowed to use their own runner up markers during the Grand Prix.

Athletes must use the markers provided by the LOC at the event site.

Officials will provide tape for relay athletes at the exit of the Call Room.

27. Official implements

All official implementation provided by the LOC appears on the World Athletics certified list. Please find the list at the bottom of this document (Annex 1).

28. Personal Implements

29. Athlete bibs

Numbers:

Each athlete will receive four (4) bibs, each one showing their number. They will be distributed at the Technical Meeting. The bibs that are not collected will be taken to the TIC.

The other bibs will be used for the athlete's backpack and for the throwing bench (for wheelchair track athletes) for easy identification.

Numbers must be worn in accordance with World Para Athletics rules and must not be cut, folded or obscured in any way. Failure to comply with the rules may result in disqualification and/or penalty.

30.Relays

Relay bibs (the ones that have the country code, e.g. JPN), which must be worn on the front of the athlete, will be supplied in the call room. Athletes must wear their personal bib on the back.

Wheelchair relay athletes will wear only the bib with the country code on the back of their racing chair.

31. Hip numbers

Athletes competing in track events will also receive two adhesive lane numbers in the call room prior to entering their event. Lane numbers must be secured to both sides of the athlete's shorts/legs/helmet, as appropriate.

a. Uniforms

If a uniform problem is identified, a World Para Athletics or Local Organizing Committee representative may request that the incident in question be corrected. NPCs are required to take the necessary steps to correct uniform infractions. They must make all unauthorized and/or excessive markings, including designs associated with trademarks. No publicity, political, commercial or otherwise, is permitted. Such violations of the Uniform and Equipment Regulations must be achieved by making invisible (e.g., by removing or tastefully covering) infringing trademarks and commercial design elements and other non-conforming elements.

b. Inspection protocol during the competition

In the Call Room and within the event, and prior to the Medal Ceremonies Technical Officials, World Para Athletics and Local Organizing Committee staff are responsible for ensuring that athletes and team officials comply with the Uniform and Equipment Guidelines. If at any time, a Technical Official (TD, ITOs, ATOs, NTOs) or World Para Athletics representative observes a violation of uniform or equipment rules, they are expected to report it through the regular channel.

Before participating in the competition or any ceremony, non-compliant uniforms, equipment and accessories must be modified to comply with the Uniform and Equipment Regulations.

Any violation of the rules may result in disqualification of the athlete.

32. Call Room

The Call Room is located next to the warm-up area. All athletes, guide runners and assistants will use this Call Room.




Figure 5 Call Room Location Map

a. Personal belongings

In accordance with the call room procedures, a strict inspection will be conducted to detect illegal and prohibited items that athletes may have in their possession. No electronic devices (e.g., radios, tablets, cell phones, cameras, etc.) will be allowed. Any items that do not conform to World Para Athletics Technical and/or Advertising Rules and Regulations will be confiscated.

Confiscated items can be retrieved in the Post Event Control (PEC) once the event is over.

Track athletes will enter the competition area ready to compete and their personal belongings may be collected in the Post Event Control.

Field athletes will only be allowed to bring one backpack into the competition area.

33. Equipment Registration

It is the responsibility of the athletes / NPC to ensure that their equipment is in the storage area prior to their event.

Throwing Frames should be taken to the Storage area (Warm-up track entrance) to be checked. They will be before the first entry time to the Call Room. After the check, the throwing frames will be transferred from the equipment storage area to the competition site.

At the end of the event, they will be transported back to the storage area.

Racing Chairs and Runner Frames must be taken to the storage area with the para-athlete before the first hour of entry to the call room. Here they will be checked by the technical staff assigned for this purpose.

34. Call Room presentation schedules

All athletes must report to the call room according to the scheduled times. In case the number of participants in the field events is particularly large, slight modifications may occur.

a. The preliminary schedule for the Call Room is as follows:

a. The premimary semestate	
Track events	30 minutes
Seated throws	35 minutes
Ambulant throws	50 minutes
Jumping events	50 minutes

A detailed schedule of all Call Room times will be posted in advance each day and will be displayed in the TIC, the warm-up track and in the Call Room.

Note: Throwing Frames, Racing Chairs and Runner Frames will be checked in the storage area prior to the first hour of the Call Room.

In accordance with Rules 5.4 and 5.5, an athlete shall be excluded from participating in any event in which he is not present in the Call Room at the relevant time as published in the Call Room calendar, resulting in his exclusion from all subsequent events.

b. Call Room Procedures

The following verifications will be carried out in the Call Room.

- Identification of the athletes by their accreditation and bib name.
- Check the athlete's uniform.
- Inspection of personal belongings

Measurement of the maximum allowable standing height (MASH) of athletes.

In accordance with Rule 6.13 of the World Para Athletics Rules and Regulations, the actual height of an Athlete in their Competition leg prostheses shall not exceed their MASH. The height of Athletes shall be measured in the Call Room by Call Room Judges. If an Athlete fails to comply with this Rule, then the Athlete will not be permitted to start the event and shall be shown in the results as "DNS" in accordance with Rule 6.21

The following equipment will be provided by the LOC in order to allow for an Athlete's height to be measured in the Call Room:

- Stadiometer;
- Metal Measurement
- o Tape Spirit Level

The stadiometer will be placed in an area of the Call Room with a level surface that (base of the stadiometer or ground) is solid and suitable so that athletes can stand without damaging the spikes attached to their prosthesis.

d. Checking the spikes

Check the spikes of the shoe or prosthesis (number, shape and size). For track, pyramidal spikes up to 7 mm are allowed (no compression or needle spikes). The maximum spike size for javelin and high jump is 9 mm. If they do not comply, athletes will be asked to change them to the correct size.




Figure 7 Reference Image of Allowed Spikes

e. Checking of masks, eye patches and tethers.

The same procedure will apply for guides-runners and assistants who access the Call Room with an athlete. The guides-runners and assistants will receive their vest in exchange for their accreditation, which will only be returned at the Post Event Control at the moment of returning the vest.

Teams must ensure that all their athletes and equipment comply with the Rules before entering the Call Room to avoid delays.

The accreditations of the competing athletes, runner-guides and assistants will be collected at the Call Room and returned at the Post Event Control.

Upon completion of these formalities, athletes, runner guides and assistants must follow the instructions given by the officials in Final Call Room before being taken to the FOP.

35.FOP

All athletes, runner guides and assistants, accompanied by competition officials, will enter the FOP as instructed by the officials. During an event, no athlete or assistant may leave the competition area without the permission of the Chief Judge. In cases where an athlete or assistant must leave the competition site, an official will accompany the para-athlete. Hydration will be provided to all athletes in the competition area.

36.Starting Blocks

Athletes in T11, T12, T13 and T20 categories must use the starting blocks provided by the LOC.

- a. The starting blocks available on the warm-up track will be different from those on the competition track.
- b. Starting Blocks on the warm-up track

The warm-up track blocks will be as follows:

37. Warm-Up Track

The warm-up track will be subdivided into lanes 1 and 2 for walking athletes and 3 and 4 for wheelchair athletes.

a. Prohibitions on the track:

No throws will be done on the warm-up track.




Figure 10 Render of Warm- Up Track

38.Event

Time of event

Starters commands will be done in English.

For wheelchair races of 200 m and over, upon entering the FOP for the competition, athletes will be allowed to complete one lap before getting to start position.

Upon entering the FOP for competition, athletes will be allowed to complete one lap before reaching the starting line.

In horizontal jumps and Ambulant throws, the order of competition for the fourth, fifth and final round of events will be the reverse ranking order recorded after the first three rounds of events.

In seated throws, there will be no inversion of the throwing order and all athletes will have six (6) attempts.

In events where a qualifying round is required, the qualification for the final will be carried out according to the Qualification Regulations (see qualification section).

39. Coaching Zone

Exclusive seating will be provided in appropriate areas for field event coaches. These will be accessible by accreditation along with a coaches' seating pass which is available at the TIC prior to the event.

40. Timing, measurements and results

Deporte Virtual and FECOL PARA ATLETISMO will provide the official timing and measurement.

41. Post-event procedures

Athletes will leave the FOP through the Mixed Zone located at the exit after the finish line.

The media may conduct brief interviews in the Mixed Zone.

After passing through the Mixed Zone, athletes will move to the Post Event Control (PEC) where they will be able to collect their clothing, belongings and accreditation.

At the exit of the Post Event Control, Team Managers may check if the athlete has been called for a Doping Control. If this is the case, they must return to the TIC to pick up a Doping Control pass to accompany their athlete to the testing area.

42. Doping Control

Athletes selected for doping control will be notified in person and accompanied to the antidoping area by an anti-doping chaperone as soon as possible after they have finished competing.

43. Medal Ceremonies

The first three athletes in each individual event (including runner guides) and the first three teams in each relay race will receive a gold, silver or bronze medal respectively (in accordance with the event viability criteria and World Para Athletics Rules and Regulations March 2024). When a delegation competes in the first round of the relays and in the final with more than four athletes, only the four athletes (plus the guide runner if applicable) in the final will receive medals during the official ceremony. The other athletes (and guide runners, if applicable) will receive their medals later at the TIC.

All Medal Ceremonies will be held at Medal Plaza.

The podium for the Medal Ceremony will be located on an alternate stage close to the Pedro Grajales International Track and Field Stadium at the Medal Plaza.

The LOC staff will gather the first three athletes or relay teams in post event area and notify them specifying the time at which the para-athlete must report to the waiting room for their ceremony.

Athletes must wear the official uniform of their delegation during the Medal Ceremony (guide runners must wear the same uniform as the athlete during the Medal Ceremony). They are also expected to wear a championship bib, which will be given to them while waiting for the ceremony.

During the playing of the anthem and the raising of the flags, they must face the flags and always behave in a respectable manner. Medallists will not be allowed to bring a national flag or any other items to the ceremony.

It is the athlete's responsibility to ensure that they are in the waiting at the time indicated in the Post Event Area. The LOC cannot delay any ceremony due to late arrival of athletes. In such cases, the ceremony will be held without the athlete and the Team Leader/Chef de Mission may collect the respective medal at the TIC at the end of the competition day. A medallist may not delegate the receipt of their medal during a Medal Ceremony for any reason. All athletes may bring one member of their staff with them to Medal Plaza.

Note: If the para-athlete is not present at the time of the Medal ceremony, only a delegate or designated representative wearing the proper delegation uniform may replace the para-athlete at the time of the medal ceremony.




Figure 11 Medal Plaza Location Map

44. Technical Protests

Protests will be handled in accordance with the March 2024 World Para Athletics Rules. Protests will be processed by the Technical Information Center (TIC).

45. Claims

Complaints regarding the result or execution of an event shall be made within 30 minutes of the official announcement of the result of that event.

The LOC will be responsible for ensuring that the time of the announcement of the official result is recorded.

In the first instance, any claim must be presented verbally to the referee by an athlete, someone acting on their behalf or by an official representative of the team. Such person or team may complain only if they are competing in the same round of the event to which the complaint relates.

The Referee may decide on the complaint or may refer the matter to the Video Referee.

If the Referee makes a decision with which the NPC disagrees, the NPC shall have the right to appeal the decision.

When the referee is not available, the claim must be made on the appropriate form at the TIC within the 30-minute time allowed.

46.Events

For an event to be medal valid, at least two (2) para-athletes from different NPCs/NFs must be officially entered. Each para-athlete may enter up to 5 individual events and one relay.

The top three world records will be awarded \$1,000 USD each.

47. Award Considerations

Only one award per athlete per event will be given to the athlete who breaks the world record in his respective event.

This award may be given to the same athlete if they break world records in different events.

This award will be given ONLY to the first three (3) NEW world records that occur during the Grand Prix Cali 2025.
