2.8 ENTRY FEE

3 CLASSIFICATION

This event offers international classification for the following impairment types:

- Vision Impairment (VI) – 18 February – 19 February 2026

IPC will schedule athletes with a New or Review status pursuant with regulations.

An athlete will only be permitted to undergo International Classification if he or she:

- Is licensed with their respective IF, pursuant to the relevant provisions of each IF;
- Has been entered into the event by the entry deadline;
- Has submitted Medical Diagnostics information (Medical Diagnostic Form and supporting documents) to each sport's athlete database (SDMS for World Para Sports, ISAS for IBSA sports, etc.) by the final entry deadline.
- Classification outcomes will be communicated by email at the end of the day – estimated to be around UTC +10:00 (21:00 local time).

4 MEDICAL INFORMATION

4.1 MEDICAL SERVICES AT THE VENUE

There will be no provision of medical services. The Mater Hospital Brisbane and PA hospital are within close proximity.

4.2 INSURANCE

Each NPC must ensure that all members of their delegation are appropriately insured, including coverage for travel, liability, accidents and repatriation. All delegation members must have appropriate accident and health insurance accepted in order to compete.

No medical insurance will be provided to any of the participants. All participants are responsible for obtaining their own medical insurance (including Repatriation Coverage) and will be responsible for any medical expenses resulting from participation in the event.
