

World Para Alpine Skiing Competitions Season 2018/2019

Athletes must have a valid 2018/19 World Para Alpine Skiing license and classification status to be considered to compete.

Athlete must be internationally classified with either a 'Confirmed' sport class status or a 'Review' sport class status with a review date after the 2018/2019 season (R19).

1 World Para Alpine Skiing World Cups qualification model

Maximum number of athletes in both genders and three classes on Para Alpine skiing World Cup event is 90.

Athletes must meet the following criteria to compete in World Para Alpine Skiing World Cup Competitions:

1.2. World Para Alpine Skiing World Cups wild card application

In Speed events, athletes that have met the point standard for their respective category in one of SG or DH will be considered “Wild Card Eligible” and may apply for Wild Card. If the race quota for a category has not been filled, the remaining quota spots, or Wild Cards, will then be allocated based on World Ranking in the relevant discipline (e.g. the discipline of the race in question). If there is one slot available in SG and two athletes apply: Athlete 1 has 85 SG points and Athlete 2 has 80 DH points, then the slot will be awarded to Athlete 1.

In Tech events, athletes that have met the point standard for their respective category in one of GS or SL will be considered “Wild Card Eligible” and may apply for a Wild Card. If the race quota for a category has not been filled, the remaining quota spots, or Wild Cards, will then be allocated based on World Ranking in the relevant discipline (e.g. the discipline of the race in question). If there is one slot available in Slalom and two athletes apply: Athlete 1 has 85 Slalom points and Athlete 2 has 80 GS points, then the slot will be awarded to Athlete 1.

2 World Para Alpine Skiing Europa Cups/NorAm qualification model

Athletes must meet the following to compete in World Para Alpine Skiing Europa Cups/NorAm Competitions:

Speed Disciplines (Downhill, Super G and Super Combined):

- Men must have points below 240 WPAS points or less on the WPAS points list in DH, SG or SC to qualify for DH, SG and SC.
- Women must have points below 280 WPAS points or less on the WPAS points list in DH, SG or SC to qualify for DH, SG and SC.

Giant Slalom:

- Men must have points below 280 WPAS points or less on the GS WPAS point list.
- Women must have points below 300 WPAS points or less on the GS WPAS point list.

Slalom:

- Men must have points below 280 WPAS points or less on the SL WPAS point list.
- Women must have points below 300 WPAS points or less on the SL WPAS point list.

2.1 World Para Alpine Skiing Europa Cups/NorAm wild card application

Speed Disciplines (Downhill, Super G and Super Combined):

- For European Cup wild cards, the competitors must be at a maximum 320 WPAS points on either the SG, SC or DH WPAS Points lists and be WPAS Internationally Classified.

Technical Disciplines (Giant Slalom and Slalom):

- For European Cup wild cards, the competitors must be at maximum 340 WPAS points on either the GS or SL WPAS Points lists and be WPAS Internationally Classified.
